I am calling on AirBnB to use their platform to distribute clear guidelines to all guests about what is, and isn't, appropriate in rural areas like the Highlands and to show "I would like to see AirBnB

guidance to guests on the importance of taking litter home, how to drive on single track roads and show respect to other drivers, and finally, a reminder that local residents are here all year round."
